



In April 1964 by instruction of then Ministers of Planning, Roberto de Oliveira Campos, and of Finance, Otávio Gouveia de Bulhões, a working group was created, comprising of high-level Brazilian experts and foreign consultants, to launch a research program on economics and long-term planning for Brazil.

On September 10, 1964, the Bureau of Applied Economic Research – EPEA – was established, directed by João Paulo dos Reis Velloso.

Since May 1990, our denomination is Institute of Applied Economic Research – IPEA. A Presidential decree designated our mission to prepare economic and social studies, researches and analyses.

At that time, there were no graduate courses in economics in Brazil, which made us a pioneering institution in the field of Brazilian economic research.

That is how our history began.

Our initial endeavor has not changed: to serve the country as a major disseminator of information and knowledge.

With the means at our disposal, we are always ready to point out the paths to development.





IPEA'S MISSION.

The Institute of Applied Economic Research – Ipea is a public foundation within the structure of the Ministry of Planning, Budget and Management. Ipea's main mission is to assist the preparation, formulation and enhancement of public policies, through researches, studies, indicators and assessment methods for government actions.

To be in the forefront of the formulation, elaboration, monitoring and assessment of public policies.


To provide support for major government projects and activities, providing assistance in the implementation of comprehensive and integrated strategies.

lpea's database is available on the Internet for anyone to access, at the website:

So far this website has registered over one million visits.

The database comprises of five thousand data series with information on population, employment, wages and income, production, consumption and sales, national accounts, public finance, money and credit.

IPEA ECONOMIC QUARTERLY (GAC).

GAC is the group responsible for macroeconomic research and analyses. Its activities include quarterly reports and meetings with government officials and representatives to debate Brazilian current economic results, its short-term trends and monitor public policies. GAC has held over one hundred of these quarterly meetings.

All regular GAC publications are available on the Internet, such as its Economic Quarterly Bulletin and Short-Term Analysis Notes. GAC also researches and develops macroeconomic forecast models and new economic indicators.

THE IPEA LIBRARY.

The Ipea Library is one of the largest and most traditional libraries and it is renowned in Brazil for its comprehensive collection of publications in economics.

It opened in Rio de Janeiro in 1967 and in Brasilia in 1970.

The library's collections are especially strong in economics, economic and social planning, with approximately fifty thousand items, comprising of books, dissertations and other documents, plus about six hundred titles of journals and periodicals.

One of the features of the IPEA Library is that its collections are available to the general public, with free access to the bookshelves.

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
